Sharroky Hollie, Ph.D.

Sharroky Hollie is a tenured, assistant professor at California State University, Dominguez Hills. Dr. Hollie is the co-founder of the nationally acclaimed laboratory school, Culture and Language Academy of Success (CLAS) in Los Angeles. Dr. Hollie is also the executive director of the Center for Culturally Responsive Teaching and Learning, which is a non-profit organization dedicated to providing stellar professional development for educators desiring to become culturally responsive. With the Center, Sharroky serves as a national expert, traveling around the country training thousands of teachers. Sharroky has been acknowledged by several groups as one of the top professional developers in the country.



Rick Wormeli

One of the first Nationally Board Certified teachers in America, Rick brings innovation, energy, validity and high standards to both his presentations, and his instructional practice, which includes 36 years teaching math, science, English, physical education, health, and history, and coaching teachers and principals. Rick's work has been reported in numerous media. Paula is a former special educator who has served as a classroom teacher and inclusion facilitator. Her professional interests include differentiating instruction and inclusive schooling. She is the author or co-author of more than 15 books and products. Paula is also the director of a documentary film titled *"We Thought You'd Never Ask": Voices of People with Autism*.



Gay Ivey, Ph.D.

Gay Ivey is the Tashia F. Morgridge Chair in Reading in the Department of Curriculum and Instruction at the University of Wisconsin-Madison. She is a former middle school reading teacher, and she received her Ph.D. from the University of Georgia.. She studies engagement in reading and writing and its consequences for young people and their classroom communities. She has written about her research in journals such as *Reading Research Quarterly*, *Journal of Literacy Research*, *The Reading Teacher*, *Journal of Adolescent & Adult Literacy*, and *Voices from the Middle*. She is a member of the International Literacy Association's Literacy Research Panel, and she is Vice President of the Literacy Research Association.
